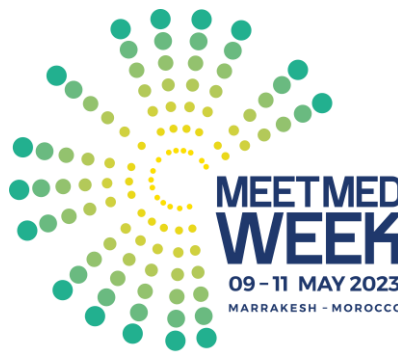

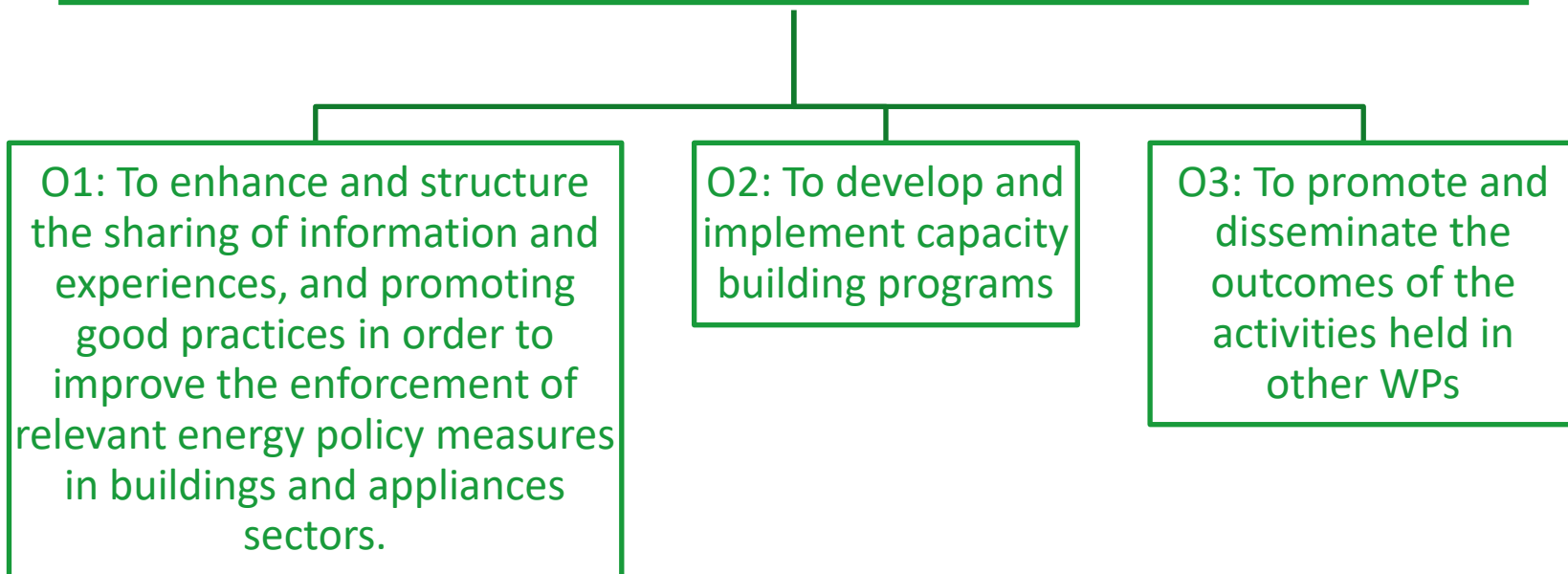

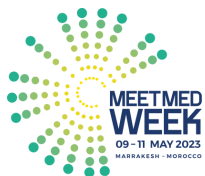

## meetMED II at the COP27: messages

A well stabilized legal framework with building codes, minimum energy performance requirements and standards is essential to support the development of new more efficient buildings or deep renovations of existing ones.

The development of a set of tools related to the labelling of buildings or their systems/components is essential to promote a positive differentiation and drive better solutions and efficient technologies [...]

Capacitation of Professionals, Citizens and Public Authorities on buildings renovation enables the countries to achieve national targets in line with global ones, thanks to behavioural changes and governance capacities, among others.

The development of fair and well-balanced financing systems can assure robust support to both sustainable new buildings and existing ones, as well as they can provide sustainable economic impact and other benefits.

A fiscal ecosystem that promotes energy efficiency and renewable energy in buildings is an enabler for societal change and new financing opportunities [...]

[...] Cooperation at regional level is a common practice that can be further boosted [...] by means of, for instance, a common lively database of good practices accessible and fed by every country/initiative.
