Energy Efficiency in Buildings in the Mediterranean Region

- The MED Region is a Hot Spot for climate change, as the area is warming 20% faster than the rest of the world.
- Growing energy demand due to growing population and behavioral patterns (fossil fuel to respond their needs).
- The building sector is one of the largest energy consumer sectors of the meetMED target countries, which makes it a main target for NEEAPs.
- **Egypt & Lebanon** have the largest share of energy consumption in the building sector.
- Implementation is still hard to assess and one main challenge is **enforcement**.

Regional Expert Network (REN network)



meetMED REN reached more **100 national experts** from national energy agencies and departments of **13 Mediterranean countries**.

The meetMED REN consists of **four thematic task forces**, with a focus on:

- EE and RE strategies and policies;
- EE and RE monitoring tools;
- EE in buildings;
- EE for appliances.

The meetMED REN experts strengthens and multiplies technical expertise to support national governments to implement EE and RE policies and measures.

Together, they created instruments shared at regional level, such as policy recommendation.
