✓ Enhance and structure the sharing of information and experience and promote the exchange of practices, including through national stakeholders' networks




✓ Create favourable conditions to fasten the convergence of national procedures on EE in buildings related matters.

Harmonizing, peer learning and country/policy grouping

Group of policies to be improved/implemented	Possible countries involved – peer learning - harmonization
Revise, improve and implement energy efficiency building codes framework with a special focus on enforcement procedures and links to licensing procedures and current fiscal/subsidies policies.	Libya, Algeria, Egypt, Tunisia, Lebanon
Set-up of voluntary EPC using synergies with EPB standards, and setting up an energy performance rating system for public buildings	Morocco, Palestine, Algeria
Reviewing, integrating, and improving the National Energy Efficiency Action Plans and other Strategies such as National Energy and Climate Plans to include specific actions that boost building related solutions/technologies.	Jordan, Lebanon, Morocco
Efficiency Funds and relation to financial sector, linking EPC systems to financing and Energy Performance Contracting	Jordan, Morocco, Egypt

Addressing common needs and tools

Common Needs

- Multilevel governance: lack of capacity for local authorities delivering national policies
- Lack of experience implementing the policies: from energy building codes to EPContracting
- Measure, report and verification: procedures to link policies and NDC's
- Construction professional training: need for increased qualification and certification

Tools

Synergies with city twinnings

Peer learning and staff exchange programmes

Delivering technical support programmes between all countries

Develop **common training tools** – synergies
with MOOC programs

 Policy alignment/contribution to NDC, NEEAPs and other strategies and international projects - What's in it for buildings? How does meetMED II contribute and vice-versa?




- Final policy needs and implementations/improvement plans per country + remapping with Good Practices and common needs
